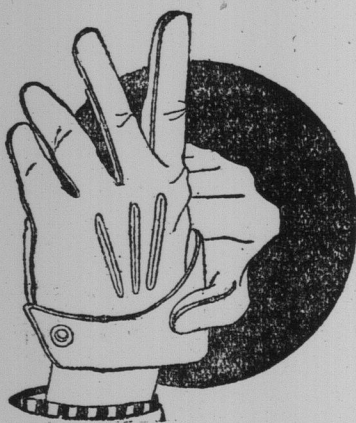

Fredericton, Oct. 17—(Special).—Chas. N. Clark died this evening at his home, 581 Brunswick street, after a lengthy illness. In early life he was a manufacturer of footwear in this city. A widow and one son, C. W. Clark survive. The funeral will take place Friday afternoon.
