**LONDON MAY BECOME A CITY WITHOUT SLUMS**  
London, July 12.—(A. P. by mail).—Twenty-two of the worst slum areas in London are to be wiped out by the London county council. The work is to be spread over the next ten or twelve years, and the government will assist in it.

"When the scheme, which involves nothing less than the clearance of all the slum areas in London, is completed," says Colonel Levitt, chairman of the Housing Committee, "it will have entailed the displacement of some 45,000 people, and an expenditure of many millions of pounds. The main idea is to make London a slumless city."

"Such work cannot, of course, be done on a strictly economic basis, but London will benefit greatly by the intensive campaign it is intended to pursue, for better housing all round will mean better health and therefore a happier people."
