Kipling, who had just begun to make his name known, was touring the world, and during his trip through the United States he went to Elmira especially to see Mark Twain. The account of the visit and interview is described by Mark Twain as follows:

"Kipling spent a couple of hours with me, and at the end of that time I had surprised him as much as he had surprised me—and the honors were easy. I believe that he knew more than any person I had met before, and I knew that he knew that I knew less than any person he had met before. He was a most remarkable man—and I am the other one. Between us we cover all knowledge, he knows all that can be known, and I know the rest."
