TERRIBLE SUFFERING. CRUELTY ALLEGED.

AN EXPLORING PARTY TO THE TERN VALLEY. A BRITISH SHIP'S CREW MAKE GRAVE ACCUSATIONS.

They Run Short of Provisions and Two of the Number Die From Starvation—One Body Taken by Wolves, the Other Buried.

By TELEGRAPH TO THE GAZETTE. New York, June 12.—A dispatch to the Herald from San Francisco says a party of California explorers have had a terrible experience in Alaska. They went to the valley of Ternok for prospecting purposes. On the homeward trip when provisions gave out, they became very weak. Myriads of flies and mosquitoes added to their misery and two of the party died of exhaustion and starvation.

The others managed to push on and dried salmon which they devoured like famished wolves. They returned for the bodies of the two who had perished. One was eaten by wolves and the other buried.

WINTER AND SPRING WHEAT. Their Area and Condition as Reported from Washington.

Washington, D. C., June 12.—The area of winter wheat, as compared with the area harvested last year, is 111,155,000 bushels; barley, 107,101,000 bushels; oats, 97,000,000 bushels.

In comparison with 1889, the increase in wheat acreage is quite moderate. The winter wheat crop is encouraging upon the southern and eastern borders of the spring wheat district, notably in Iowa and Wisconsin, under the protection of crop diversification and new methods of cultivation, while spring wheat, estimated to be 100,000,000 bushels, is of higher price.

The condition of winter wheat has declined only one point. The average of New York is 90, Pennsylvania, 97, Georgia, 88, Texas, 96, Ohio, 99; Michigan, 80, Indiana, 90, Illinois, 93; Missouri, 89; Kansas, 85, California, 90.

The first monthly statement of Wisconsin, which is the highest in the Northwest, is in Wisconsin and Minnesota. Over 100,000 bushels of wheat were injured by frost in Wisconsin.

Drought in May has greatly injured the crop in the southern states as far better crops in the southern states are far better than in the northern states. Conditions have improved in the Ohio valley, but the crop is not so good as in the Ohio valley.
