### WITH UNITED STATES

TOKIO, March 5—The Nichi Nichi in a leader this morning protests against the "persistent determination of the people of California to persecute and exclude the Japanese" from that state. In the proposed law limiting aliens to a five years ownership of land, the Nichi Nichi can discern but one intention—to deny the land owning right to Japanese. The paper advises the Government to take steps "to counteract such an outrage against the Japanese," and expresses the belief that
