SHIPPING NOTES.

C. P. R. steamship Empress of Ire-
land, now on her way to Liverpool
from this port, took away a cargo val-
ued as follows: Canadian goods, \$117,
225; foreign goods, \$25,872. Total,
\$452,995. Her wheat shipment was
24,460 bushels.

Royal mail steamship Empress of
Britain, Captain Murray, re-

ceived orders yesterday of Cape Race
to proceed to St. John, N. B., via Hal-
ifax on account of ice conditions in the
St. Lawrence River. She has on board
1,451 passengers, as follows: 181 sal-
oon; 447 second cabin and 323 third
class passengers.

The six-masted barkentine Everett
G. Griggs, which is captained by E. R.
Stirling, left Victoria April 12th for
Sydney, N.S.W., with 2,500,000
feet of lumber. Auxiliary engines will
be installed in her in the near future.

The Everett G. Griggs is the only six-
masted barkentine in the world.

The new steamer City of Sydney
which is due at Sydney, N. S., about
the first of next month, is a splendid
vessel of 2,500 tons gross register. She
is 265 feet in length, 40 foot beam,
with a depth of hold of 21 feet, and
will speed 15 knots. She will have ac-
commodation for about 115 saloon and
54 stateroom passengers. The steamer
is also equipped with Marconi wire-
less, electric light and steam heating
and has every modern comfort for the
passenger traffic. She will be com-
manded by Captain D. C. Fraser, for-
merly of the steamer Bonaville,
which was lost some months ago, and
who has served over a quarter of a
century in the service of the Black
Diamond line. She will have a crew
of 55 officers and men.
