The Government Defeated in Ontario's District—The Dawson Route—Browne's Brats.
OTTAWA, Aug. 6.
Yesterday the first election for the Commons, under the new law, occurred in Napierville, to fill the place made vacant by the appointment of Dorion to the bench. Coupal, Opposition, was elected by a majority of twelve votes.

At the last election Coupal was beaten by one hundred and eighty.

Yesterday, in Bonaventure, a Conservator was elected to the Quebec Legislature by a large majority.

The East Elgin election takes place today. The Grits here bet on a majority of 300.

Public opinion is so severe against the Government, for its gross mismanagement of the Dawson route, that the Government has determined to throw the blame on the contractors. Carpenter arrived this morning, on a summons from the Government, to show why the contract should not be taken from him.

ONTARIO, Aug. 6.
The National states that it has not been sued yet for its charges against Brown. It refuses to apologize or retract one word, and dares Brown to proceed with the trial. In case he does, it declares, a confession of guilt will be wrung from his own lips.

OTTAWA, Aug. 5.
At the Labor Congress, today, the Secretary in his report pointed out the injuries which would be inflicted upon the laboring and mechanical classes by the reciprocity treaty. The committee adopted the report. Upon the motion for the adoption of the report, an amendment was offered that it be referred back to the committee to strike out the portion referring to reciprocity. The mover said that while opposed to the treaty, he was not opposed to the amendment expressed in the official report of the Congress. The amendment was carried.

The Government of Manitoba have sent representatives to the Dominion authorities urging the speedy commencement of the Pacific Branch of the Pacific Railway.

A Sackville clergyman, who, while preaching a sermon on Sunday evening, perceived a man and woman under the gallery in the act of kissing each other behind a hymn book, did not lose his temper. No, he remained calm. He beamed mildly at the offenders over his spectacles, and when the young man kissed her the fifteenth time, he merely broke his sermon short in the middle of "thirty," and offered a fervent prayer in behalf of "the young man in the pink necktie and the maiden in the blue bonnet and gray shawl, who were profaning the sanctuary by kissing one another in pews 78." And the congregation said "Amen." Then the woman pulled her veil down, and the young man sat there and swore softly to himself. He does not go to church as much now as he did.

The Times, of Madisonville, Ky., announces the sudden death, occurring recently, of a singular old man named Wm. Craig, who fell dead while standing in his doorway after eating his breakfast. For nearly 15 years he had refused to live in a house, and lived for a number of years in a large hollow tree, doing his own cooking and washing. This tree was finally blown down, burning down, and lived up to the day of his death. During the war he was robbed of some \$400 or \$500, the accumulation of years of toil and industry, and this loss probably unbalanced his mind and caused him to lead this singular, hermit-like life. At the time of his death he was believed to be the possessor of some property, but it is thought he has buried it where it will never be found. He appears to have lived a quiet, peaceful, harmless life, shut out from the rude world in undisturbed seclusion and solitude.

The Austrian Government have instituted a prosecution against Bishop Rudiger of Linz for an address at Kremsmuenster, in the course of which he remarked that he himself might be the object of measures similar to those undertaken against the Prussian bishops, in which case his flock would be bound to stand by and defend him. The Pope, he added, had been obliged to condemn the ecclesiastical legislation not only of Prussia and Switzerland, but of Austria in 1868—and 1874; but his hearers being good Christians, who loved the Pope, would not willingly obey such laws. The Bishop has once before been prosecuted and convicted, and subsequently pardoned by the Emperor.

The Earl of Dunraven and party, among whom are Dr. Kingsley, brother of the Canon, have been enjoying all sorts of adventures and hairbreadth escapes in Colorado. They seem to have been particularly successful in fishing, and hundreds of speckled beauties overload their baskets daily. They have also killed many number of animals of various sorts, and the Earl had a pitched battle with a female mountain lion not long ago that came very near cutting much weeping and wailing at Dunraven Castle. He was alone, having separated from the Earl's party, but he had time to raise his gun to his shoulder and fire when the creature went for him. The ball hit he fairly in the belly, but it did not stop her career. She lit on the noble man, overturning him, and was just about to spring at his throat when he lay prostrate at her mercy, when a timely shot from Dr. Kingsley brought her down. The Earl soon much amused at his narrow escape, but otherwise none the worse for it, although he fasted "these mountain lions were blasted nasty things to meet when alone, you know."
