to such Person or Persons of such Lands to be hol- Cotton Wool. den in freeand conmon Soccage, in like Manner as Drugs of all Sorts Lands are now holden in free and common soccage in tuat part of Greal Briluin cullid England; subject nevertheless to Hayment to His Majesty, by, such Grantec or Granteces, of such Sum or Sunpe of Money as and for a Commutation for the Finess and other Dues which would have been payable to His Majesty under the original Tenurts, and to such Conditions as to His Majesty, ur to the said Governor, Lieutenant Guvernor, or Person administering the Governmerat as aforeceqid, shall seem just and re:sonable; Provided always, that on any such frehs Grant being made as aforessid, no Allotmentro Appropriation of Lands for the Support and Maintenance of a Protestant Clergy shall be necessary; but every such frech Grant shall be valid and effectual without any Specification of Lands for the Purpose aforesaid ; uny Law or Statueto the contrary thcreof in any wise notwithstanding.
XXXII. And be it further enacted, That it

Treble Costs. shall and may be lawful for His Majesty, His Eeirs and Successors, to connmute with any lerson holding Lands at Cens ot Rentes in any Censive or Fief of His Majesty within either of the said Provinces, and such Person may obtain a Release from His Majesty of all feudal lights arising by reasun of such Tenure, and receive a Grant from His Majesty, His Heirs or Successors, in free and common Soccage, upon Payment to His Majesty of such Sum of Money as His Majesty, His Eleirs or Successors, may deem to be just and reasonable, by reason of the Kelease and Grant aforesaid; and all such Sums of Money as shall be paid upon any Commutationsmade by virtue of this Act shall be applied towards the Administration of Justice and the Support of the Civil Goverrment of the said Province.
XXXIII. And be it furcher enacted, That if any Person or Persons shall be sued or prosecuted, for any thing done or to be done in pursuance of this Act, such Person or Persons may plead the General Issue, and give this Act and the special Matter in Evidence; and if the Plaintiff or Plantiffs, Prosecutor or Prosecutors, sball become nonsuit, or furbear the Prosicution, or discontinue his, her, or their Action, orif a Verdict shallppass against him, her or then, the defendants shall have Treble Costs, and shall have the like Remedy for the same as in Cases where Costs are by Law given to Defendquts.
