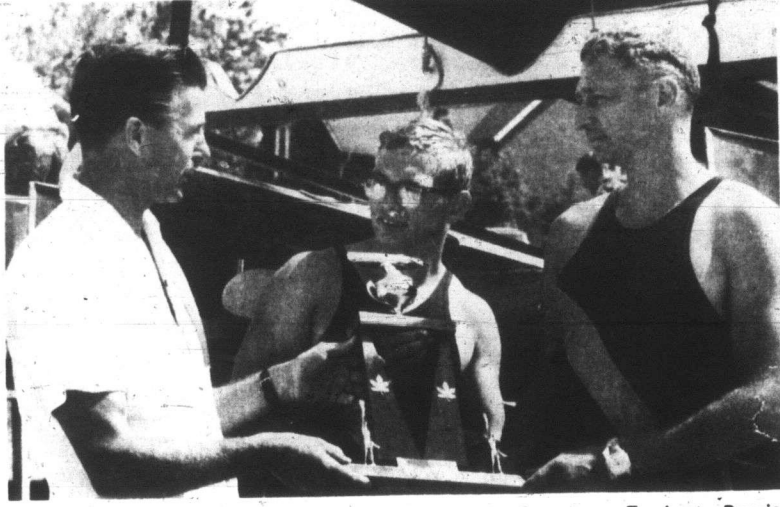

In a total of 26 events, the powerful Mississauga paddlers finished first in 17 and second in the other nine. They also picked up two second place finishes in events which they won.

One of the top competitions of the day, the final one on the program, saw Bill Collins' war canoe crews squeeze out a narrow victory over Olympic coach Jim Mosman's crew from Balmy Beach. The final margin in this one was just about four or five feet after the 1500 meter race.

Collins feels that the local club can go through the regular season's competitions undefeated and the Missis-

sauga boys' have set their sights on the National Championships which will be held in Ottawa on August 6-7.

Cartierville, the perennial national champions, edged out Mississauga by 17 points last year but, according to Collins, "we are stronger and better balanced this year so it should be quite interesting".

Jim Reardon of Mississauga was the top man of the day as he was a member of five winning crews. "Bubba" Boaz was on four winning entries.

The Mississauga paddlers rolled up a total of 151 points which was approximately

twice that of the West Rouge Canoe Club which finished second. Balmy Beach finished third, the Mohawk Canoe Club fourth and the Toronto Sailing and Canoe Club fifth.

The annual Dominion Day Regatta will be held at Centre Island this Thursday and Mississauga and the Don Rowing Club hope for a big day there.

The weatherman co-operated fully to make last Saturday's competitions here a big success. It was a sunny day with a cool breeze blowing over the river. Most of the spectators felt it a little on the cool side but the paddlers more than welcomed the breeze.

their second straight game at the Port Credit Arena last Thursday night.

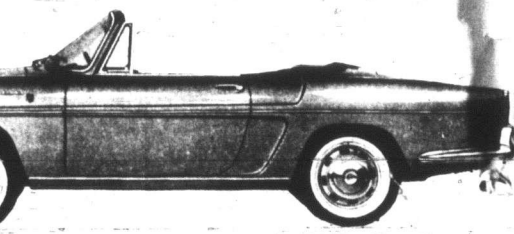
Sharing the spotlight with Keegan was veteran goal-
