Dear Colonel Price,

In September 1925 a Miss Denise Larde arrived in Quebec with several trunks full of Paris finery, some of which was for Mrs. Ernest Lapointe.

Her trunks were passed by the Customs by arrangement with Ottawa, but when she arrived at the Chateau Frontenac Sergeant Zaneth of the R.C.M.P. seized her things. I believe they were gotten out without very much duty.

We are trying to get a copy of this report from the Mounted Police and have reason to believe that it has been removed from their files.

Sergeant Zaneth is now either in Toronto or Niagara, and I think it is important to have someone approach him and get his story in connection with the matter.
