



Ottawa, July 31st., 1918.

Sir,

On receipt of your letter of the 24th instant, in regard to purchase of an artificial limb for Peter Beaucage, the matter was referred to Messrs. Authors & Cox, of Toronto, whose reply is enclosed herewith. I also enclose a catalogue and blank form of measurement which gives all information required. It is thought that a peg leg being cheaper might be just as serviceable and you should discuss the matter with him. The cost of Beaucage going to Toronto to see this firm would not be great and certainly would be more satisfactory if he can bear the expense. When you have gone into the matter thoroughly and consulted with Beaucage and he has arrived at a definite conclusion, you should communicate with the Department and final action will be taken.
