dry. I don't if they ever get any water now or not. The next is Lower Similkomeen -MR. ALEXANDER: Mr. Ball says the Indiens used water from that

oreak until the railway out them out.

MR.BALLS: I think Mr.Ball's statement was the Indians were diverting water from the areak until the time the railway cut up the ditch.

MR. BROWN : That is quite correct. They were using the water on the Reserve until the reilway out up their ditch and out them off.

MR.ALEXANDER : Then there is no doubt about that. MR.BROWN: No doubt about it, but I take from what you say there is no right except the fact that they were taking water.

MR.ELLIS: Do you think there would be enough water for a everyone?

MR. BROWN: I think there is unless they are allowed to take that water for north as they want to do, then there will not be enough, but in the immediate vicinity there is no question there is sufficient water for ell of us. Last year was very low water.

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MR. FLLIS: I have not any information on it. I am taking the statements as they are given here. One person is waiting for the reilway to come through and put a pipe under the railway and the other person is waiting to get across the Indian Reserve, I think they had better get together.

MR. BROWN: I have offered. There is no objection I

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
