TORONTO, ONT.—The Gooderham Estate have announced their intention of erecting a business block on the northeast corner of King and Sherbourne streets, at a cost of \$50,000, although the work may not be begun this year.—The Board of Control desire tenders by August 4th for a number of concrete sidewalks, also for structural steel and iron work required in erection of addition to isolation hospital.—Mr. Fellowes, waterworks engineer, states that an extension of the waterworks system is necessary. He recommends that a tunnel be constructed from the main pumping station to Mugg's Landing, immediate relief to be provided by continuing the six-foot steel pipe to the south end of the tunnel and connecting it with the crib at Hanlan's island by a 5-foot steel pipe.—Should the observatory be allowed to remain in Toronto, it is probable that a new Meteorological building will be erected on a site suggested by the University authorities just east of McMaster University. It is said that there is also on the tapis a new provincial art gallery for Queen's Park.—Specifications of concrete sidewalks to be built at Calgary, N. W. T., may be seen at the office of the CONTRACT RECORD; estimated work, 25,000 square feet; tenders close August 8th.—New plans will be prepared for proposed improvements to the Berkeley street fire hall.—The Ontario Government will provide \$4,000 towards proposed improvements to the Gravenhurst Sanitarium.—Building permits have been granted as follows: M.
