MAP MADE IN 1700 IS FOUND AT VATICAN St. Louis .- An ancient map of the area where St. Louis now stands, believed to be the oldest in exist-ence, has been found in the Vatican

ence, has been found in the Vatican Library, by the Rev. Gilbert J. Garraghan, S. J., of St. Louis Uni-versity. Father Garraghan, who has been in Europe gathering material on the history of the Jesuits in America, announced the discovery upon his return here. The map is dated 1700. Among other things, it shows a settlement at the junction of the Mississippi and Des Peres rivers, where a mission of the Jesuits was established, undoubtedly giving the one river its name of "Des Peres," or "The Fathers." The existence of this settlement was not known until Father Garraghan recently found a record of it in some historical material in Canada. It was a small fur-trading post, and had a life of only a year, but knowledge of it is of considerable historical value.
