SUBRANT WORMS.
A writer in the *Fruit Recorder* says... there is no necessity of breeding cur-... rant worms. This is done by leaving... the fruit untrimmed, the worms always... attacking the new growth first. His... plan is this: In starting a bush not... to be cut from one to three stems, and... to grow all the strength of the root to... that support. As hinted above, sprouts... should be cut from the roots each spring... and they must be rubbed off when six... inches long. All current growers are... aware that worms first make their ap-... pearance on the new growth and then... spread over the bush. Consequently... they sprout, so worms. This is just as... simple as two and two make four. I... have followed this plan for the past... two years to my satisfaction and have... largely over the efforts of worms on one... or two bushes where my plan was not... fully carried out. But such currants... I never saw grow, the common red... bush being nearly as large as the... cherry currant and a better bearer. I... had a few bushes that actually broke... down from their load of fruit.
