In her cell at the county jail, where she will be held pending the grand jury's action, Mrs. Franks set forth the warning which she hopes will save others from her fate.
Her eyes swollen from tears, and still bearing the marks of her husband's brutal assault, she presented a pitiful picture as she told of her misery, all of which she laid to liquor. 'He was a demon when he was drunk,' said Mrs. Franks. 'He would come home at all hours of the day and night and the first thing he would do was to walk toward me and strike me. He would land on my face, my head or neck, just wherever he happened to strike, and he would beat me until I managed to get away.'
At the coroner's inquest Mrs. Franks told how she had driven a knife into her husband's abdomen to save her own life. Although she declared she inflicted the wound without any intention to kill, merely in self defence, the coroner's jury held her to the grand jury.
Tears came to the eyes of George Davis, a taxi-driver, as he sat in his cell at the bridewell last evening, thinking with a heavy heart of his brother, who had died of consumption in a poorly lighted room at 614 1/2 Haled street, attended and consoled in his last hours by an aged widowed mother.
'When I heard that Gus was dying I wanted to go and bid him good-bye and console mother, but the cursed liquor held me under its helter-skelter power so completely that I could not sober up enough to appear before them.'
I began to hate myself because of my weakness, so I went to Justice Quinn and asked him to lock me up for a few days, so that my irresistible craving for drink could not be satisfied.—Chicago Examiner.
