**A MONTENEGRIN VICTORY.**  
Cettinje, Dec. 30.—After heavy fighting for three days between Montenegrins and Austrian troops, the Austrians are in retreat on one part of the front, the war office announced today. The statement follows: "There is violent artillery fighting along the whole front of the sanjak army. The enemy continued his attacks against Raskovagora, but the Austrians, after three days of tenacious fighting, are now retreating."

**THE AUSTRIAN REPLY**  
London, Dec. 30.—The Austrian reply to the second American note on the Ancona incident states the commander of the Austrian submarine has been punished for not sufficiently taking into account the panic aboard the Ancona which rendered disembarkation more difficult.



### SYNOPSIS OF COAL MINING REGULATIONS

Coal mining rights in the Dominion in Manitoba, Saskatchewan and Alberta, the Yukon Territory, the Northwest Territories and in a portion of the Province of British Columbia may be leased for a term of twenty-one years at an annual rental of \$1 an acre. Not more than 2,560 acres will be leased to one applicant. Applications for a lease must be made by the applicant in person to the Agent or Sub-Agent in the district in which the rights applied are situated.

In surveyed territory the land must be described by sections, or legal sub-divisions of sections, and in unsurveyed territory the tract applied for shall be staked out by the applicant himself. Each application must be accompanied by a fee of \$5 which will be refunded if the rights applied for are not available, but not otherwise. A royalty shall be paid on the merchantable output of the mine at the rate of five cents per ton. The person operating the mine shall furnish the agent with sworn returns accounting for the full quantity of merchantable coal mined and pay the royalty thereon. If the coal mining rights are not being operated, such returns should be furnished at least once a year. The lease will include the coal mining rights only, but the lessee may be permitted to purchase whatever surface rights may be considered necessary for the working of the mine at the rate of \$10.00 an acre.

For full information application should be made to the Secretary of the Department of the Interior, Ottawa, or to any agent or sub-agent of Dominion Lands.

### AUSTRIA SIDE STEPPING.

London, Dec. 30.—The Austrian note, while announcing the willingness of the Austro-Hungarian government to pay an indemnity for American victims of the Ancona, declares the Government "cannot admit responsibility for damage caused by the justifiable firing on the fleeing vessel or by the capsizing of the boats before the torpedo was fired."
