## CONTINGENT RECRUITS.

It is Now Said That Two Additional Squadrons Will Be Sent.

Applications for Enlistment Coming in From All Quarters of Dominion.

MEMBERS OF PERMANENT CORPS CANNOT GO.

OTTAWA, Dec. 6.—A cablegram received last evening from the Imperial Government states that the troopships Manhattan and Rance will be sent out to take the second regiment of Canadian Mounted Rifles to South Africa. The Manhattan has a capacity for 17 officers, 450 men and 300 horses. The Rance for 30 officers, 450 men and 300 horses.

A number of telegraphic applications for positions on the force were received from Dawson, and saying that the men are hurrying out over the ice. It is understood that the full quota will not be made up until they arrive. The nominations for the ranks of captains and lieutenants were submitted to His Excellency yesterday, and will probably be forwarded to the Imperial Government to-day.

### CLEMENCY INVOKED.

The Case of Murderer Laplante, Who is to Be Executed on Dec. 13.

MONTREAL, Dec. 6.—Ridcliffe, the hangman, has wired that he can be here next week to carry out the sentence of the law in the case of Laplante, the man sentenced for the murder of Madame Lefebvre in Ste. Catherine. The date fixed is Dec. 13th, unless the Cabinet decides to commute the sentence. Word comes from Ottawa that such is not likely to be the case, unless some new and important evidence is forthcoming.

### PREMIER LAURIER

Invited to Deliver an Address Before an American University.

CLEVELAND, Ohio, Dec. 6.—President Charles F. Thwing of the Western Reserve University has sent an invitation to Premier Laurier to deliver the Washington birthday address at the University.

### DEAN O'MEARA DEAD.

WINNIPEG, Dec. 6.—Very Rev. Dean O'Meara, lecturer at St. John's College, and one of the best known Anglican clergymen in the North West, died this morning of typhoid fever.

### TORONTO LIBERALS

Want a Trial of Manitoba Act Before It Becomes an Ontario Law.

TORONTO, Dec. 6.—In his inaugural address to the North Toronto Liberal Club last evening, President Dickenson, in dealing with the question of prohibition, said he thought it would be prudent to wait a trial of the Manitoba Act before introducing so disturbing an element into our social life. This sentiment was not vigorously applauded.

### ANOTHER SEAT VACANT.

BEAUCHAMPEL, Que., Dec. 6.—Mr. L. J. M. P. for Beauchamp, this morning admitted corruption by agents, and the seat was declared vacant.
