1. The Pyramid of Khufa-in height, 15.75 feet, preaath, 746 feet. 2. Pyr. mid of Khafra-height 448.5 feet oreadth, 690.65. 3. Pyramid of Men kara-height; 203 feet; breadth. 352 78 eet. The construction of these enorm ous masses has long been an insoluble ni tery, but later generations have suc-seeded in solving the problem.
