Jellicoe to Head Settlers' Council

FORMER ADMIRAL ACCEPTS POST TO BOOST OVERSEAS SETTLEMENT.

London, May 18.—(Canadian Press)—Viscount Jellicoe, former naval commander and former Governor-General and Commander-in-Chief of New Zealand, has accepted the chairmanship of the Overseas Settlement Council.

The Council of Overseas Settlement was recently formed under the auspices of the Church England for the dissemination of information with regard to openings for settlers overseas and for the purpose of looking after the selection and welfare of emigrants.

The Council Assembly in February, on motion of the Bishop of London, passed a resolution approving of the establishment of such a council.

It was stated at the time that it was understood that the British Government would contribute one-third of the working expenses in connection with the Council's undertaking, the total being estimated at £7,500, and the Dominions would guarantee another third of the cost.

CLAIM OF "LIFELONG FRIEND" GRANTED.

Mr. Justice Eve gave his decision in the claim of Miss Bertha Amelia Frances Vyver, of Mason Croft, Stratford-on-Avon, the residuary tenant for life of the estate of the late Miss Marie Corelli.

Miss Vyver is also one of the executors of Miss Corelli's will, and the question was raised in a summons taken out by the other executor, Mr. Alexander Strachan Watt, whether he ought to admit or reject the claim of Miss Vyver to £6,871 14s. 7d. with interest, deposited by Miss Corelli with the Bank of Scotland, Edinburgh, and to £3,332 5s. 10d. withdrawn by Miss Corelli from deposit at the bank. It was stated that Miss Corelli placed £210,000 on deposit for Miss Vyver.
