The waters after circling and secting in the huge basin find an ontilet through masses of jagged rock, which continually break up the current into dis-jointed streams. For a long way the waters are bounded in by precipitons walls of rock, multi at the the level ground. is reached, when they quictly mingle with the water of the lake. The stream next passes through Looh Ness, a beautiful sheet of water, 24 miles in length, and in many places very deep. At the southern extremity of the Loob stands Fort Augustus, which was built after the rebellion of 1715 to over-ave the Highlands, and which in 1867 was sold to Lord Lovat. The Fort, of course, is now dismantled, only a few old guoe pointing their innocent mouths to the water, but the ancient houses and the beautiful green slopes and embank-ments render the place quite beautiful. The steamer next enters Lock Oich, the contral lake of the chain, along the wastern bank of which stretches the ter-witory of Cameron of Loohiel, whose fathers were among the most neted of the old lighland chiefhains. Not far off are the ruins of an old eastle, a former stronghold of the chief of Macdonnell, and near to that again a monument com-memorates the morecnary vengeance in-fitted by a former chef of Glengary on the murderers of the Keppoch family.
