BOY SAVED 27 LIVES.

Chicago, Feb. 21.—Arthur Egan, the 17-year-old boy who has saved 27 lives in Lake Michigan, will be presented with a medal by the Royal Humane Society of London, England, tomorrow night. William Windham, the British consul here, will make the presentation. The society gives only two medals a year, and this is the first time that one of them has been awarded to a resident of the United States.

STRICKEN DOWN WHILE DRIVING

Death Came Very Suddenly to Mr. John Dingle.

Returning From a Funeral at Mount Pleasant He Suddenly Succumbed to Apoplexy.

While driving home from Mount Pleasant Cemetery yesterday, where he had attended the funeral of Miss Gerry, daughter of Ald. Wm. Gerry, his employer, Mr. John Dingle expired very suddenly from an attack of apoplexy. He was driving home in a Gladstone sleigh with three companions, Messrs. Evans, Boyce and Nugent, employees at Gerry's mill, when he asked one of them to take the lines, saying he had a terrible pain in his head and that he could not see. The men drove with all speed towards his home, 125 Langarth street. Near King street he told the driver to take care or he would upset the sleigh. These were his last words, and shortly afterwards he became unconscious. Dr. Piper, who chanced to be driving along the same road, was overtaken, and pronounced Mr. Dingle to be affected with apoplexy. Shortly after he entered his home he succumbed.

Mr. Dingle was teamster at Gerry's mill and was a very popular man. He was born in England, but had lived here for many years. He was a member of the Chosen Friends and Court Brighton, A. O. F. His widow and one son, Mr. Harry Dingle, of Briscoe street, survive.
