BOARD OF WORKS FOR PUBLIC BATH

Recommended Last Night That Sum Be Placed in Estimates to Establish Three.

NO CURBS AND GUTTERS

In the North End Until the Street Railway Company Makes Promised Improvements There.

At a meeting of the board of works last night, Chairman Tancock brought up the matter of putting down curbs and gutters in the north end. In view of the fact, however, that the improvements to the street railway in that district have not been settled upon, it was decided that it would be unwise to go ahead and spend several thousand dollars putting down curbs and then have to tear it up again if the rails are moved. It was decided to have a report from Engineer Wright before anything is done.

The chairman stated that he had noticed that on many of the streets the street car rails had sunk to such an extent that it was impossible for the city to crown the roads. He thought the street railway should be notified to raise their tracks. The matter was finally disposed of by a motion of Ald. Saunders that wherever the city is repairing streets on which cars run that the city engineer notify the street railway to raise their tracks.

Engineer Wright reported that boats such as the committee required for the swimming baths in the river can be purchased at \$47 each from a firm in Hamilton. He recommended that dinghies be secured, as they will not upset.

The board recommended that a sum be placed in the estimates next year sufficient to build three bathhouses and to secure three boats.

A. W. Hennig, croaker, at 474 Dundas street, asked permission to be allowed to leave an ice cream sign that he has attached to a tree in front of his premises. The committee decided that they could not grant the request, as it would establish a precedent.

Mr. Ingram, of Florence street, stated that a new sidewalk that had been started had not been finished. Engineer

Several applications for the position of head engineer were received, and on motion of Ald. Saunders, were referred with others to be taken up at a future meeting.

Mr. Glass, of Thames street, notified the board that a fence between his property and the city's on Thames street needs rebuilding. Engineer Wright suggested that the committee go down and see the place before anything is done, as the ground in Mr. Glass's yard has been raised, and all the water will run in on city property. It was decided to leave the matter over until another meeting.

Engineer Wright recommended that a young man who can do typewriting be engaged as an assistant to Miss Lawrence in his office. The matter was left for the engineer to get a suitable party.

Chairman Tancock reported that he and Ald. Morgan had gone to see a tree on the property of Mr. Tanner, on Bridport street, and that Mr. Tanner is willing to build a retaining wall to protect at his own expense. Engineer Wright thought the tree should come down altogether. Ald. Tancock thought it was not right to grant a privilege to one man and not another, and cited a

case in South London, where a wall had been built.

Ald. Saunders moved that the matter be left to the engineer. Engineer Wright said the tree should come down. Ald. Saunders' motion carried.

"G" COMPANY'S PICNIC

Enjoyable Time Spent by Citizen Soldiers at the Rifle Ranges.

In a baseball game between the right and left halves of the company, the right side won. The sports continued until dark.
