Cooling Summer Drinks.

Dear Miss Grey: Please give me a recipe for cream nectar and any other good cool drink that can be made at home.

A.—Cream Nectar.—To 2 quarts of boiling water add 2 pounds of granulated sugar, and 2½ ounces tartaric acid. Beat the whites of 2 eggs and pour into a bottle with a little of the warm syrup; shake briskly then pour it into the kettle of syrup and stir it through well. Boil three minutes, removing the scum as it rises. Flavor with any preferred extract, and bottle. When wanted to use, take two or three tablespoonfuls of the syrup to a glass of ice-cold water and one-half teaspoonful of soda.

Lemon Syrup: Take the juice of twelve lemons; grate the rind of six in it; let stand over night; then take six pounds of white sugar with a little water and boil until a thick syrup is formed. When quite cool strain the juice into it; put into bottles securely corked. A tablespoonful in a glass of water makes a delicious, refreshing drink.
