

WHY LONDON'S TAXES ARE HIGH.

Public Service Corporations That Pay Taxes and Those That Do Not.

This is the fourth of a series of articles on "Why London's taxes are high." The next will appear in an early issue.

In a previous article the status of the municipally-owned public utilities of London has been dealt with. It has been shown that the waterworks and electric departments of the city of London, instead of paying taxes on their buildings, equipment and business as other corporations are doing, escape without the payment of a cent towards the reduction of the mortgages on the property of the ratepayers put there to enable the quipment of these departments in the first place. It is vastly different with the private-owned public service corporations. These corporations contribute about a half, in fact.
