

# WANT FARMS ON **BUSINESS BASIS**

Agrarians in Convention At Saskatoon Launch New Movement.

Demand Remuneration For Product Based On Cost of Production.

SASKATOON, Sask., July 25 .- A new farmers' movement, aimed at placing farming on a business basis, ls presaged by the first convention in camera of the Farmers' Union of Canada, which opened here this morning.

The basis of the movement, as far as can be gathered from the information that has leaked out, is to place farmers in such a position that they will receive remunteration for their product equal to the cost of

The possibility of the new organization entering politics will be dis-cussed at the convention, which will last three days. Whether the new group will form a separate body in Dominion or provincial politics, or both, or whether it will identify itself as part of the existing Progressive party, is not yet clear.

## Giant Meteor Plunges Into Lake From Sky.

SASKATOON, July 25.-With an explosion that shook the district to a distance of 20 miles around, a giant meteor plunged from the sky into Big Quill Lake, near Wynyard. Sask., east of here, yesterday.

The fireball, seen by many in the district, dropped from a clear sky, and clouds of steam arose from the lake for some time after it had sunk in the

The shock of the explosion was felt in Wynyard, where houses trembled.

Between midnight and 1 clock this morning another meteor was seen descending to the east of Saskatoon. It was visible in the city, but no reports have been received regarding where it landed

The speech from the throne was characterized by its brevity, the necessity for the calling of the session being given as the need for the adoption of legislation that would place the province in a position to co-operate with the Dominion and other provinces to the establishment of a

"In view of the grave economic conditions prevailing throughout the province," said the speech from the throne, "my government decided to call a meeting of the Legislature to consider such concurrent legislation as will place the province in a position to co-operate with the Dominion and other provinces in establishing a satisfactory board."

# TO TEST DELORME SANITY IN ASYLUM

Beauport Superintendant Asked For Certificate On Mentality of Prisoner.

QUEBEC, July 25 .- Dr. M. D. Brochu, superintendent of the Beauport asylum, where Adelard Delorme has been confined on orders of the attorney-general of the province following the finding by the jury that he was unable to stand his trial on the charge of murdering his halfbrother Raoul, gave out the following statement today regarding a report that he had refused to certify De-

"I have been asked to give a certificate of insanity by the civil court in Montreal to allow the interdiction of Delorme and the appointment of curators. I was told that I could do this without examining the patient. However, as this has to be given out under my personal responsibility I have thought that it is my duty to place the accused under observation as in similar cases. I have been very busy since the internment of De lorme, and have been unable to make the necessary examination. Consequently, I have asked for the ordinary delay, and have not yet completed my observation, which may take a fortnight or more.

Not New Procedure.
"This conduct on my part is in accordance with the system followed in any other cases, and is not an attempt to evade any responsibility for the certificate I will then give.

"Delorme is not placed with the other patients, but has been given guards to prevent any attempt of escape. Since his incarceration this patient has been behaving very well, and has abided by all the regulations of the institute, though he is placed in private rooms. He has asked for no special treatment. He has caused us no worry, and, as far as reported, has manifested no intention of starting to write his memoirs as has been For the present Delorme will not be allowed even to receive his parents, and this order will remain in force until such date as

found suitable." Left to Government.

Asked whether a report on his part to the effect that Delorme was sane would mean that he would be placed before the jury for trial, Dr. Brochu "Not necessarily. It would be left to the attorney-general to act and he would be in no way bound to follow any finding. I will only have
