With town gas, neither boilers nor firemen are required, little space is needed, and electric lighting plants may be located in crowded districts where steam engines would not be allowed. It is only within a very few years that large gas-engines have been made practicable. But they, already supply 7000 horse power for electric lighting in Great Britain, and operate 1100 arc-lamps and 90,000 glow-lamps in Germany.
