OUR WATER WORKS.

As will be seen by our legislative summary in another column, the act to enable us to provide the town with a system of water works and a system of sewerage has passed the House of Assembly. It will, no doubt, pass unobscured through the Upper House and become law.

OUR WATER WORKS.

This necessary step gained, it remains for the inhabitants of the town to bring it into effect. Mr. J. E. Saxon, one of the commissioners appointed under the Act, having occasion to visit Halifax last week on business, called on Mr. MacKeating, the engineer of the city water works, and laid before him the nature of the work, and asked him for a rough estimate. Mr. MacKeating kindly drew up the same, and the water into the town for a sum not exceeding \$15,000, estimating six miles of pipe as follows: a 8 inch pipe for the next mile, and 4 inch for the remaining two miles.

OUR WATER WORKS.

The average system, from all the information at hand, will cost in the neighborhood of \$1,500. The estimate for both systems have, however, about seventy-five per cent. in excess of the cost based upon outside figures. The cost based upon outside figures, was based on \$30 for short tons, whereas Capt. Hugh Fraser, hardware dealer of this town, has received orders from Glasgow for forming him that the pipe can be laid down here for \$20 for long tons, making a difference in our favor, in the amount we will require, of \$750, and it is known that in several other particulars the work can be done for a much less sum. Taking the very outside figures, however, the expense of both systems will not cost the town more than \$18,000.

For this comparatively small sum, which is but slightly in advance of what has always been given as the cost of the water works alone, we furnish our town with improvements that will place her among the foremost in the province, and do more for her future growth, health and general prosperity than anything else that we know of.
