Potter's Linniment, for sale at Palfrey's... Valparaiso, Aug. 11.—The reservoir belonging to the Mena Brewery burst at 8.30 o'clock on Saturday.

Ottawa, Aug. 12.—A telegram from British Columbia indicates that the Klondike River Indians are growing peaceable and the expedition sent to Hazelton is not likely to meet with serious resistance.

The mortality statistics for the principal cities of the Dominion for the past year shows that Halifax had a death rate of a little over 18 per thousand of the population, compared with 20 per thousand in Montreal.

London, Aug. 7.—There was a fatal collision at the Loddington on the 1st inst. between a passenger train and goods train. The locomotive and guards van of the goods train mounted up over the locomotive of the passenger train and landed on the foremost passenger carriage.

Mumford Bros., Argyle St. Butter, choice dairy, per lb. 12 to 13; best, per lb. 10 to 11; eggs, per doz. 15; hams and bacon, per lb. 8 to 10; beef, quarters, 5 to 7; mutton, by the cut, 7 to 7 1/2; lamb, by the cut, 7 to 8; veal, by the cut, 6 to 7; turkeys, 10 to 12; fowls and chickens, 50; cats, 25; hay, per ton, \$12.00 to \$13.

The defunct Maritime Bank of St. John, N. B., had a book-keeper who was just now in his way. He kept two sets of books—one to show to the directors and another to show the real condition of the bank's funds, with which he was calculating. The deficiency of the bank is \$1,300,000.

Ottawa, Aug. 13.—In an interview published here this evening Hon. Mr. McDougall urged the introduction of a bill to amend the Customs Act, and of a bill to amend the Liquor Act, claiming that the system has produced great benefits in the liquor trade in the interest of the liquor vendors in the profits from the sale of spirits.

THE ONTARIO CROPS.—Toronto, Ont., August 6.—Supplementary crop reports received to night from all parts of the Province of Ontario show that all the crops, with the exception of spring and fall wheat and hay, will be above the average in yield and quality.
