Enjoyed a rare treat on Thursday eve-  
ning, May 3rd, when Rev. Henry G.  
Mellick, B.D., of Hantsport, deliver-  
ed a most interesting and instructive  
lecture at the Gem Theatre, his sub-  
ject being "Canada from Ocean to  
Ocean". The views of Canadian  
scenery from the Atlantic to the Pa-  
cific were exceptionally good, the  
lecturer in his characteristically in-  
teresting manner describing clearly  
these views to his audience and add-  
ing witticisms and striking anecdotes  
from his personal experiences as a  
traveller through Canada from East  
to West. The lecture was educational  
and of especial value to young people,  
giving them a clearer idea of the ex-  
tent, resources, and natural beauty of  
their great heritage Canada. If Mr.

Mellick should again visit Lawrencetown  
and repeat his lecture he would  
be sure of an even larger audience  
than that which greeted him on  
Thursday night. The presence of the  
Lawrencetown band which favored  
the meeting with several fine musical  
selections added much to the interest  
of the meeting, as did also the pres-  
ence of about thirty school boys and  
girls who had been previously well  
trained by their teacher, Mrs. Corkum,  
and who sang most acceptably sev-  
eral patriotic songs. A hearty vote  
of thanks, moved by Rev. A. H. Whit-  
man, and seconded by Mr. L. D. Han-  
ley, expressing the deep appreciation  
of the audience, was extended to Mr.  
Mellick for his splendid lecture, to  
the Lawrencetown band and their  
school children and their leaders,  
Mrs. Corkum and Mrs. R. J. Shaffer,  
for their inspiring music, to the lan-  
tern operator (Mr. Sam. Gesner) for  
his efficient services, and to Mr. Henry  
Sanford for the use of his theatre.

The meeting was under the auspices  
of the Men's Brotherhood, Mr. E. C.  
Shaffner, the President, conducting it  
with his usual tact and grace. The  
sum of \$25.00 was realized.
