The authorities at the Elkhorn school use their excellent school accommodation as an inducement to draw our children away from our own school at Birtle, where there is yet but inferior accommodation. During the year there were two united with the Church. They were two of the oldest women on the Reserve. There was another woman baptized, but is not yet received into full communion with the Church. A few days ago the Y. M. C. A. on the Reserve, seeing that there was yet \$3 unpaid of the \$30 promised for the missionary's salary, paid the \$3 out of the fund of their association. The total amounts paid by the Indians during the year were :—

Pioneer Missionaries from England.

The Rev. Wm. Carey, the first missionary sent from England to India, was born in 1761. He was a very clever boy, eager to
