CELERY SOUP. Boil a small cupful of rice in three pints of milk until it will pass through a sieve. Grate the white parts of three heads of celery on a bread grater; add this to the milk, after it has been strained. SNOWBALL CUSTARD. - Make a boiled SNOWBALL CUSTARD.—Make a boiled custard, and when it is quite cold, put it into a deep glass dish. Beat to a stiff froth the whites of the four eggs that you omitted. In the custard, adding eight drops of the oil of lemon. Take a tablespoonful of this froth and form it into balls of regular size and shape, dropping them on the top of the dish of custard. Do not let them touch one another. You may lay a leaf of a General Jacqueminot rose on the top of each ball if you choose. you choose.

A LIGHT PUDDING.—A light pudding is made of one pint of flour, two teaspoonfuls of baking powder, and a little salt, with milk enough to make a thin batter. Butter some cups and set them into the steamer, and put a large spoonful of the latter into each cup, and then a spoonful of jam; cover the jam with another spoonful of latter, and let the pudding steam for from twenty minutes to half an hour. Make a sauce of two eggs, a tablespoonful of butter, and one cup of sugar; beat them together, and pour over them one cup of boiling milk. This pudding is delicious with fresh fruit, berries or peaches.
