This little book must be a valuable aid to conscientious parents in the understanding of their rights and obligations. Marriage is a most serious matter and young people should not be permitted to keep company until they are prepared to contract an early marriage. All modern difficulties in the way of making exemplary Christians and good citizens must be faced and overcome by conscientious parents.
