CURRENT TRADE CONDITIONS

ONTARIO.

At a meeting of the Lumbermen's Association of Ontario, held in Toronto last week, a resolution was adopted by the members present agreeing to curtail their operations in the woods during the coming winter. This action does not imply that the lumber market is weakening, but is simply an indication that the lumbermen recognize the advantages to he derived, in view of the high cost of labor and supplies, in curtailing the output of lumber next season. Such a course is to be commended, and it is hoped that operators will strictly adhere to the resolution The statement was made by one large operator present that it was his intention to curtail 50 per cent, as compared with last winter, and by another that he would reduce his output 25 per cent. The pine market continues to show strength, the higher grades being particularly strong A ready market can be found for 10 and 12 inch boards, and hill stuff is also a good seller. The average price of mill culls is between \$10 and \$12, depending upon the location of the stock. A quantity of mill culls at John's Island, which would demand a high freight rate, was lately sold for \$9.50. The demand for hardwoods is improving, and it is believed that the large consumers are about to enter the market

to stock up for their fall and winter requirements. Hemlock is in good demand at an average price of \$9.50 to \$10, although it is possible to obtain from \$11 to \$12 for long lengths. Lath are holding up well, the mill price being about \$2.50 for No. 1 and \$2 for No. 2.

OURBEC AND NEW BRUNSWICK.

The shipments of lumber from Montreal during the past week have been light, and it appears that the shippers on this side are sending forward only as little lumber as possible, Considering the depression in the British market, the price of spruce deals keeps up remarkably well. Some of the large mills on the St. Lawrence are shut down for want of logs, the drives on the St. Maurice river hoving become stranded, with the possibility that they may not be gotten out until next spring. It is reported that the Laurentide Pulp Company at Grand Mere has been closed from this cause. A few weeks ago it was predicted in this column that cedar shmgles were about to advance. This prediction has teen realized, as some of the large manufacturers are now asking \$3 for extras, on Boston rate of freight Clears are quoted at \$2.70, and second clears at \$2.30.

UNITED STATES.

During the month of July the shipments of lumber by the members of the Mississippi Valley and Wisconsin Lumbermen's Associations Valley were 37 per cent. greater than for the same month in 1900. Crop conditions are more satisfactory than was expected, and as the wheat harvest is . practically over farmers are turning their attention to the buying of lumber for new buildings and improvements. Prices of white and Norway pine remain very firm, with an upward tendency, especially in Norway. At Ashland, Wis, short lengths have sold at \$11 for 2x4 and 2x8, and \$12 for 10 inch stuff. Six inch strips in common grade are selling at \$15.50, and 4 inch at \$14.50. The conditions in the Saginaw Valley are equally satisfactory. Log run is held at \$18 to \$24, box at \$14 to \$16 and mill culls at S12. Several cargoes of piece stuff have been sold to Chicago, at \$14, while common inch brings \$17. Buffalo and Tonawanda dealers are getting in large stocks and are purchasing freely, but the demand is such that they are not able to increase their stocks materially. It is menerally believed that while there is not
