Department of Psychology such as we shall have after the completion of the new building, it would be quite possible for us,
I think, to feature successfully the professional preparation
of high school teachers at McGill. Personally I believe that
this is the one obvious practical measure which the University
can take to improve the educational work of the high schools in
the province and thus to ultimately raise the standard of
scholarship in the University itself.

I need scarcely add, however, that there is one trouble with the teaching profession in this and in all Canadian provinces which no University can cure and that is the ridiculous insufficiency of the salaries offered in the teaching profession. It is really absurd to expect a man to spend five years of successful University education in order to equip himself for a profession so poorly remunerated as our teachers are at present.
