Dear Dr. Cameron:-

Let me acknowledge receipt of
your letter of June 14th.

Upon inquiry I find that the
answer to the question as to whether or not you
have been dismissed is "no". Demonstrators at
McGill are engaged from year to year and one not
re-engaged has no right to feel hurt in any way.
It constitutes no reflection on you.

Dr. Macallum told me that you
informed him last year that owing to your illness
and the matter of the French and German you did not
intend to go up for your M.Sc. last May and you also
informed him that you proposed to go to Saskatoon
and begin medical practice there, and at the same
time carry on in research work in one of the labor-
atories of the University. As a result of that
change in your plans Dr. Macallum went so far as
to recommend you for the position of Bio-Chemist in
the Sanitarium for Tuberculosis at Qu'Appelle. I
do not know whether that position has been filled or
not.

In view of your intimation
to Dr. Macallum of your future intentions he made
other arrangements for demonstrators for next year.
As I said before, there is no reflection on you and
I hope you have good success wherever you may go.
