POLICE TO TELL NUMBER ELIGIBLE. Men in Toronto Who Ought to Enlist Will Be Counted, Says Mayor.

TO ERECT A MONUMENT. Hippodrome Audience at Recruiting Meeting Endorses Memorial to Miss Cavell.

Mayor Church announced at the big recruiting meeting held at the Hippodrome last night that he would ask the police commissioners of Toronto to have the police "tap at every door" in the city and find out who were available for overseas service.

A suggestion that a monument be erected in the city to Miss Cavell, who was murdered by the Germans in Belgium, from the school children of Ontario was made by A. E. Donovan, M.L.A.

About 3000 attended the meeting. Dr. Norman Allen presided. The 45th High School band played before and during the meeting.

A song, written by Mrs. Garvin (Katherine Hale) and set to music by Gene Branscombe, was sung by Mrs. Wm. Donald Barron, and was given a good reception. The song is entitled "In the Trenches".

Mrs. Torrington moved a resolution stating that the National Council of Women desired to place on record its profound admiration of the devoted life and heroic death of Nurse Edith Cavell, who was executed by the Germans in Belgium, and by Miss Cochrane Bolton and unanimously carried by acclamation.

A suggestion was made by A. E. Donovan, M.L.A., that the National Council of Women of Ontario during November, and with the money, erect a monument to Miss Edith Cavell, in Queen's Park. Mrs. Torrington stated to the meeting that she would like to see the monument erected in the city.

Mrs. Julia W. Henshaw of Vancouver, in an eloquent appeal for recruits, asked every woman at the meeting to promise to prevent any man from leaving home going to fight for the British Empire in the hour of the nation's need. Those who withheld their men would never have the right to sing "God Save the King."

No Excuse Now. Dr. Arce Hyde called for recruits for the new Irish Regiment now being recruited in Toronto. There was no excuse for a man not joining at least in the local regiments, he said.

Pte. Saunders, who was wounded at St. Julien, and who has just returned to Toronto, made a strong plea for recruits for the Canadians.
