Construing this provision by the provision of the 18th of his present Majesty, we are inclined to apprehend that the Bill not referring to the situation of the proposed Provinces would, by this provision, sow the seeds of dissension between the Provinces. By the Act of the year 1778, “ the duties are to be always paid, and “ applied to and for the use of the Colony, “ &c. in which the same shall be levied.” But by this Bill all these duties must, from the plan of division, be levied in the *Lower* Province; and if they are to be applied to the *use* of the *Lower* Province *exclusively*, it will follow, that, though the trade and industry of the *Upper* Province
