“ or laws which may be made by his Ma-
“ jesty, with the advice and consent of the
“ Legislative Council and Assembly of

Construing this provision by the provi-
sion of the 18th of his present Majesty,
we are inclined to apprehend that the Bill
not referring to the situation of the pro-
posed Provinces would, by this provision,
sow the seeds of dissension between the
Provinces. By the Act of the year 1778,
“ the duties are to be always paid, and
“ applied to and for the use of the Colony,
“ &c. in which the same shall be levied.”
But by this Bill all these duties must, from
the plan of division, be levied in the
Lower Province; and if they are to be
applied to the *use* of the *Lower* Province
exclusively, it will follow, that, though

vince
