addition of real comforts, coincide with its actual results. The principles on which to raise a system of doctrine applicable to emigrants in general, are varied and fluctuating; an attempt, however, has been made in these pages with regard to one class following one occupation. At any rate, the preparatives to emigration, whether mental or bodily, are not, in general, the result of a hasty resolve; and it is more to direct the former in a proper channel, that has induced the compilation of these remarks.
