



Paris, May 5 .- Foreign visitors to Paris this week find the dead walls covered with recognized partially." This policy was definitely given up, when, in 1869, the Legislature almost unanimously abousned the grants that had been made for several years to such institutions. At the same time ne was putting \$12,200 in his estimates for the "partial recognition of Queen's." The S.
