Willing that \$200,000 Should Be Given Toward Hospital, With Medical Men's Rights Protected.

The mass meeting of medical men in St. George's Hall yesterday afternoon to oppose the proposal of the board of control to grant \$100,000 toward a new 1,200,000 hospital brought out four hours' warm discussion and eventually a resolution to support the proposal with conditions named by City Medical Health Officer Sheard to the effect that in the new hospital public ward cases shall be available exclusively for the faculty of medicine of Toronto University, but all other accommodation of the hospital shall be equally available to all other practitioners of good standing in the city; that what is to constitute a public ward patient is attendant, and that in the new institution accommodation is to be afforded as far as possible to patients in the order of the meeting turned down a motion by Dr. Spence that in the opinion of the medical men of the City of Toronto it would be a crime against citizens of this city to permit the trustees of the Toronto General Hospital to carry out the scheme outlined before the board of control.
