The Wheat Market Showing Wide Fluctuation.

London, Oct. 24 .- Out of sympathy with the improved opening in America, prices at the Baltic closed decidedly firmer, sellers withdrawing in many cases. Prices were 3d to 6d better than at the opening. The only sale reached was a cargo of white wheat for the United Kingdom. New York, Oct. 24.-The bulls once more had the upper hand of wheat vesterday morning. Before 11 o'c:ock they ran prices up 2 5-8c a bushel, December reaching 80 1-8c; or a recovery of more than half of vesterday's late break. The advance was attributed to the foreign markets. At noon, however, the bears jumped on the market vigorously and soon forc-

ed out sufficient long wheat to break prices 1 1-2c from the top. This was followed in turn by another rally, the market pursuing a see-saw course, Transactions up to noon were 5,000,000 bushels. Throughout the afternoon wheat was nervous, but generally firm. Considerable wheat being worked for Cal-

cutta, December moved actively over

a range from 79c to 80 1-2c; closing unsettled at 80 1-8c. TODAY'S DEVELOPMENTS. Chicago, Oct. 24.-Wheat opened excited, December 2 3-4c to 3 1-8c lower.
