TORPEDO BOAT IS CUT IN TWO

Thirty-Six British Sailors Lose Lives During Night Manoeuvres Off Isle of Wight

PORTSMOUTH, Eng., April 2.—Thirty-six men, including Lieut. Middleton, the commander of the torpedo boat, destroyer Tiger, lost their lives in the collision of the late of Wight last night between that vessel and the British cruiser Berwick.

Lights Were Out. The collision occurred at 8.10 o'clock last night. The ships were manoeuvring without lights. The forward of the British ship was struck by the stern of the destroyer Tiger.

Lieut. William E. Middleton was on the bridge at the time of the disaster and went down with the forward of the ship. The Tiger had a complement of 59 men and was of 400 tons.
