Medical Men Say That Condition of Bodies Found Does Not Support Police Theory.

LA PORTE, Ind., May 10.—Whether Mrs. Bella Guinness is alive somewhere and subject to arrest for her alleged murders committed on her farm one mile north of La Porte, or whether she was burned with her three children in her house that was destroyed by fire on April 28 is the problem that still looms up most prominently before the doctors investigating the mystery surrounding the deaths of those ten persons whose bodies have been found buried in the Guinness barnyard in the manner in which the Guinness farm house was burned.
