RAILWAY FOR PORCUPINE

Electric Road May Be a Possibility by End of Year.

The present outlook is that the Porcupine country may have a railway. Permission has been granted by the Ontario Cabinet to go ahead with the building of an electric road from Mettison thru to Mettison district. The party of prominent men who waited on the government some time ago were introduced by "Bob" Shillington, M. L. A., and included S. Ferland, C. A. Richardson and F. Chambers. The concerned parties were told that they might go ahead with the building of the road, with the proviso that the work should be completed by Jan. 1. Then, at the next session, the minister will recommend that a charter be granted, as in the case of any private bill.

The new railway will act as a feeder

to the T. and N. O. and will be a standard gauge road. All freight and passenger rates will be under the supervision of the Ontario Railway and Municipal Board.

The road is to be run by electricity, but if there is delay in securing the necessary power, permission will be given them to operate the road by gas or steam engines for a time. The line will start at or near Matheson.

To Fortify Entrance to Gulf of Par. LONDON, July 27.—In view of the recent discoveries of petroleum in Trinidad, which might be useful to the navy, and the importance which the government is considering the advisability of fortifying the entrance to the Gulf of Par.

A campaign is to be inaugurated for the annexation to Chicago of every town and village within a radius of 100 miles.

SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH-WEST LAND REGULATIONS.

ANY person who is the sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years old, may homestead a quarter section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. The applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Office, or Sub-Agent for the district. Entry by proxy may be made at any agency, on certain conditions, by father, brother, son, daughter, brother or sister of intending homesteader.

Duties.—Six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within nine miles of his homestead on a farm of at least 80 acres solely owned and occupied by him or by his father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister. In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter-section alongside his homestead. Price \$3.00 per acre. Duties—Must reside upon the homestead or pre-emption six months in each of six years from date of homestead entry (including the time required to earn homestead patent) and cultivate 40 acres extra.

A homesteader who has exhausted his homestead right and cannot obtain a pre-emption may enter for a purchase homestead in certain districts. Price \$3.00 per acre. Duties—Must reside six months in each of three years, cultivate twenty acres and erect a house worth \$300.00.
