of returned soldiers who are frequently disabled as to prevent them from resuming their former occupations have been provided, and any man who resists his disability to be of such a nature as to entitle him to the benefit of these classes is requested to make application to Mr. W. W. Nichol, Vocational Counselor for Ontario, No. 116 College Street, Toronto, when full particulars will be furnished and arrangements made for a board to enable those engaged to obtain courses of instruction in subjects suitable to their particular requirements.

In addition to getting instruction the support of the soldier and his or dependents during the period of training, and for one month after completed, is provided for, according to scale.

Cases where assistance for the families of soldiers is required are daily referred to us, and we will thankfully receive subscriptions to our "Relief Fund." Subscriptions to this Fund are assured, and payments from same are made only after careful official investigation of the case, and particulars will be furnished.
