6. GENERAL EFFICIENCY COMPETITION.—The change in the establishment of the Halifax and Eritish Columbia Batteries of Garrison Artillery, from 7 and 5 Batteries to 4 and 5 Companies respectively, will necessitate a change in the conditions regulating the General Efficiency Competition.

The present conditions are based upon a Battery unit of 3 officers, 6 N. C. officers and 35 gunners. Each of the Companies of the new establishment of the above Battalions, if not less than a total strength of 84 N. C. officers and men, will be considered as representing two units. As, however, there are only 5 officers per Company, in one of the half Companies the answers to officers' questions will be 12 instead of 8 each, thus giving the same total value to this subject. The N. C. officers' questions to remain the same, but to be answered by 6 N. C. O.'s, 2 Sergeants, 2 Corporals and 2 Bombardiers in each half Company.

The number of gun squads not to exceed four per half Company.

A subsistence allowance of seventy-five cents per diem will be made to each officer and man for such days as they are necessarily absent from Company Headquarters—leaving after 6 p.m. and arriving before 6 a.m. will not be counted as days necessarily absent. Subsistence allowance for men of detachment while in Camp will be paid to the Camp Caterer.

All affiliation fees must be paid on or before 30th June, inst.
