**ANGELIC DIVINE VIGOROUS IN HIS SPEECH**

Archdeacon Titus of Calgary Says Dr. Bryce's Remarks on the Indian Schools are Untrue.

Ottawa, Sept. 25.—Under the Juvenile Delinquency Act, passed last session, power is given the federal government to establish juvenile courts without reference to provincial authority, if satisfied that proper facilities have been provided by the municipal authorities. These "proper facilities" are now defined by order in council to be as follows: "That a proper detention home has been established and will be maintained for the temporary confinement of juvenile delinquents or of children charged with delinquency. The institution should be conducted more like a reformatory and must not be under the same roof as or in the immediate vicinity of any police station, jail, lock-up or other place in which adults are or may be imprisoned; that an industrial school exists to which juvenile delinquents may be committed; that there is a judge or justice in the municipality willing to act as juvenile court judge without cost to the federal authority; that remuneration for an adequate staff of probation officers has been provided by a municipal grant, public subscription or otherwise; that some society or committee is ready to act as the juvenile court committee."

**AN INDIAN RAILWAY CO. BUYS RAILS IN CANADA**

Halifax, N. S., Sept. 25.—A far extension of the market for Sydney rails was announced today by General Manager Jones of the Dominion Iron & Steel Company. An order has been received by the company for steel rails to be manufactured for the Southern Punjab Railway Company. The quantity, which is tons of eighty-pound rails, which are to be delivered in India, consists of 9,000 tons. The company will commence to roll the order October 15.

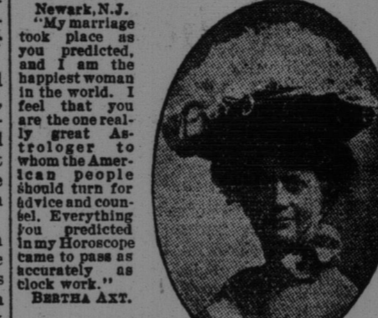

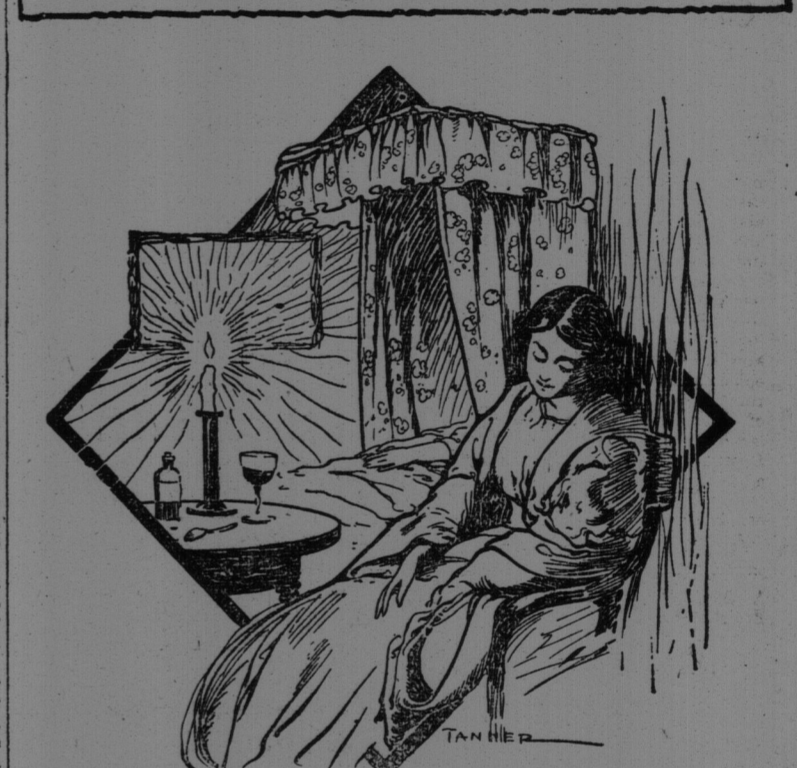
