

## PARLIAMENT TO MEET ON JAN. 7

Chief Electoral Officer's Report Cancels Hope for Earlier Session

Returns From Fifteen Constituencies Still to be Received at Ottawa

OTTAWA, Nov. 30.—Parliament will meet on January 7, Premier King announced tonight at the conclusion of a meeting of the cabinet. The Prime Minister stated that it had been the hope of the government to meet parliament on Dec. 10, which was the first tentative date announced, but the report of Col. Biggar, Chief Electoral Officer, which was placed before the cabinet this afternoon showed that it was clearly impracticable to summon parliament at the early date.

The Premier issued the following statement: "The Government has received today the following memo from the chief electoral officer with respect to the possibility of Parliament meeting on Dec. 10:

"1.—It now appears extremely improbable that by Dec. 10 all the members elected on Oct. 29 last will have been returned.

"2.—The returns of 215 out of the 241 writs have been gazetted and since the special issue of the Canada Gazette on Nov. 28, regular returns have been received from 11 additional electoral districts, making a total of 226, leaving 15 outstanding.

### WRITS IN MAIL.

"3.—For all but two of these, the writs are in the mails, some having been sent back on account of irregularity. The writ for Yukon, mailed at Dawson on Nov. 21, cannot reach here until Dec. 11, and may quite possibly not arrive until Dec. 21.

"4.—Moreover, the arrival in time of the two writs not yet mailed (Bruce North and Peace River) is problematical. In the former the final addition of the votes takes place only today, and in the latter a recount commences tomorrow at Edmonton. If this recount were prolonged, or if a recount were required in North Bruce, neither of these electoral districts would be represented on Dec. 10.

### BAGOT CONTEST.

"5.—Finally, a contest in the by-election in Bagot appears probable, and if there is a contest the return from that district cannot be regularly made until December 16 at the earliest.

### Two Frozen Bodies Found By Children

CHATHAM, Ont., Nov. 30.—The frozen bodies of Timothy Boudreau, 45, a Russian, and Frank Barber, 45, a Belgian, residents of the Ridgeway District, were found today underneath a light touring car at the bottom of a 16-foot ditch, near Ridgeway, by a party of children on their way to school. Coroner Dr. Marr, of Ridgeway, believes the two men were instantly killed when their car overturned into the ditch. The condition of the bodies indicated they had been under the car for several hours.

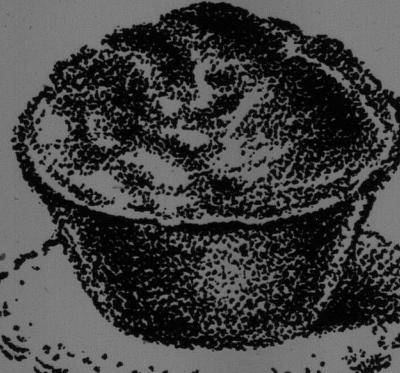

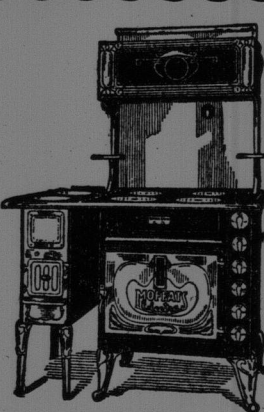
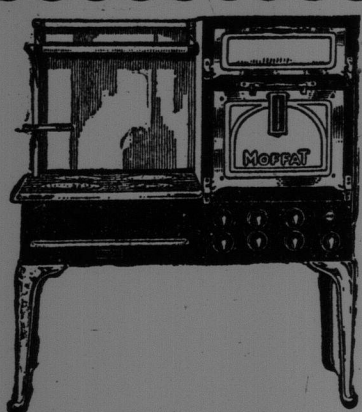
